**The Syndromic Surveillance Program, Office of Infectious Disease Services at ADHS. CHIP captures school nurse encounter data about illness syndromes among schoolchildren. The data provided from CHIP are used by public health epidemiologists to conduct weekly illness analyses for trends and aberrations, routine influenza surveillance activities, and daily active surveillance for high priority illnesses. CHIP also provides a two-way alerting mechanism, through which important health and other messages may be sent to and from school nurses. Examples of such messages are Heat Advisory messages, which are generated by the National Weather Service, and Pollution Advisories, which are generated by the Arizona Department of Environmental Quality, and sent through ADHS and AZSCN to the school nurses using the software program.
